ARRL June VHF Contest

Starts the second full weekend in June. Begins 1800 UTC Saturday, runs through 0259 UTC Monday (June 13-15, 2015) on all authorized frequencies above 50 MHz (6 Meters). For amateurs in the US and Canada (and their possessions) to work as many amateur stations in as many different 2 degrees x 1 degree Maidenhead grid squares as possible using authorized frequencies above 50 MHz. Stations outside the US & Canada (and their possessions) may only work stations in the US (and its possessions) and Canada. Stations in KH0-9, KL7 & KP1-KP5, CY9 and CY0 count as W/VE stations and can be worked by DX stations for contest credit.

General Rules For ARRL Contests Above 50MHz,now allows all entrants, regardless of category, to use spotting assistance to identify stations that are available for contacts and to announce (self-spot) their availability for contacts. Internet chat rooms, Facebook, Twitter, text messages, telephone calls, APRS, etc. can be used to announce my frequency or to find a frequency where someone else is op-

erating for all operating categories as long as they are not used to "...facilitate the completion of any contact once the contact has commenced. This means such assistance may not be used to convey receipt or non-receipt of any required element of the contact or to request a repeat of any required element of a contact." In other words, announce your frequency and location, etc. but once the contact begins, you may not use any non-amateur means to complete it. For complete detail go to the ARRL.org web site.

For Sale: 2 each Microwave Dishes

I have two dishes, professional, both with feeds for the 5 GHz band (make your own feed for other bands, I guess). Made for YDI (out of business).

The smaller one is 2.5 feet in diameter, comes without a mount (don't know if there was supposed to be an external mounting unit for it)

The larger one is 4 feet in diameter comes with a mounting system (kind of heavy).

Both are in their original boxes, unopened. I know they are solid dishes, feed included, some assembly required. The boxes are big enough to hold the entire dish, so there is no assembly of the dish as it is one piece. You will need a pickup truck for the big one. They were made by Gabriel which was located where Prodelin was in North Carolina. I believe that Gabriel is out of business and General Dynamics is using that facility to produce dish antennas for military and satellite use. Often there is some sort of documentation in side these boxes, but I cannot guaranty as I am not opening them. I could not find any on the internet.

I want \$50 for the 2.5 footer and \$100 for the 4 footer.


