Club Project – eBay Transverter Kits

Search for "Transverter" on eBay and you will likely see about a dozen different listings for boards and kits for VHF/UHF transverters. These boards originate from the Ukraine offering a low cost alternative to higher priced transverters and all-mode radios. For \$125 you get a partial kit with a case, connectors, and a few odds an ends. Not everything needed to make a transverter, but it comes close. Figure out how to mount the board, wire it all up, and you have a 5W transverter to play with on one of the four bottom VHF/UHF bands (50/144/222/432 MHz). Sound interesting? 
Classified Listings
